

The Valor Farm has been contacted, and

they provided a list of activities they need help People with - everything from Reaching mucking stables to cooking. They have volunteer days two Saturdays a month, beginning in March, on the first and

We are interested in making casseroles that can be frozen and used for the Patriots and staff. 
