

"Consider your own call ..." I Corinthians 1:26a

It was early when I received the telephone call from Big John, the church's property manager where I was serving as pastor. Too early, the time of day when all you can say is "I'll be there in a few minutes." When I arrived, Big John told me he had already called the police about the church being broken into, and the

church office's petty cash being taken.

I went into my office where papers were on the floor. Among these papers were the texts of some sermons I had preached. To my dismay, none of the sermons were missing, not even worth stealing. In a few days, I received a telephone call from a detective who had been assigned the "sermons not worth stealing" case. The person, who had broken into the church, had been arrested and confessed. I asked if it would okay for me to visit him in the local jail and was assured that would be fine.

I remember the visiting area, where he sat on one side of the unbreakable glass, and I sat on the other. We each held a phone receiver as I identified myself as the pastor of the church he had broken into. As we spoke, I told him that our church believed in a God of second chances and extended our church's forgiveness to him. He asked me to tell the congregation that he was sorry for what he had done. He said he was all alone, as fellow gang members had refused to accept his calls via the prison telephone.

I sat all day to testify for three minutes at his trial. I testified about the forgiveness our church offered and asked for leniency. The decision was quick as he was sentenced to a penitentiary. It has been a long time since we talked with each other, but I pray that, in God's time, our paths will cross again at the cross of Jesus. That is a call I will welcome. -Marc

Applications can be picked up in the church office, starting May 1, and must be returned no later than June 11. Scholarship awards will be made in July.


Amos is AOL!

Virginia Annual Conference to be Held in June

The 241st session of the Virginia Annual Conference, to be held in Roanoke, VA, June 15-17, 2023, will be focused on the theme, United as One in Mission. The theme is based on Acts 1:8b, "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." NIV

Bob Doney is Fort Hill's Lay Member to the Annual Conference, along with Pastor Marc. The 160 Health Kits assembled by the Genesis Circle will be given to this year's Conference. Also, churches are asked to share in the Annual Conference Missional Offering purpose. The groups and ministries supported by the offering change each year, but the goal remains the same: to assist people and ministries, both domestic and international. The goal of the offering for 2023 is \$150,000.

The Virginia Conference will support Refugee Resettlement, Food Insecurity in the Commonwealth, and Partnerships of Hope's leadership programs in Brazil, Mozambique, Cambodia, Haiti, and Vietnam, as well as for Native Americans, through this offering. The offering will be collected on June 15, 2023, during the Opening Worship at 10 am.
