

Blessing the school supplies and clothing on Sunday, August 27th (Pick up a list in the Welcome Center of supplies needed)



The theme of Fort Hill's July music arts camp was Wade in the Water. Thanks to Jacob for coordinating the camp and to everyone who helped to make the camp possible! It was a joyful time to have 39 children enrolled in the camp and to learn about the meaning of water in the Bible.

The story of water flows through 500+ references in the Bible. Water provides the means by which



God speaks order to the creation of heaven and earth in the second verse of the Bible - Genesis 1:2: "the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God swept over the face of the waters." The last chapter of the concluding book of the Bible, Revelation, includes these words about water through the creation of a new heaven and a new earth in Revelation 22:1: "Then the angel showed me the river of the water of life."

Among the meanings of water in the Old Testament are:

- ▶ judgment in the story of Noah's Ark in the 7th and 8th chapters of Genesis
- ► deliverance of the former slaves of Egypt who crossed through the Red Sea on dry land and into a new identity as God's chosen people in the 14th chapter of Exodus
- ▶ the promise of God's presence in Isaiah 43:2a: "When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you"

Among the meanings of water in the New Testament are:

- ▶ repentance and new life through baptism as told in the gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John
- ▶ God's eternal sustenance as found in Revelation 22:17: "Let anyone who wishes take the water of life
- ▶ new life offered through Jesus in John 4:14: "but those who drink of the water that I will give them will never be thirsty."

Vital to understanding God as the source of life and faith, the presence of water throughout the Bible affirms present life and faith through the eternity of God's creating, sustaining, and renewing presence. May the presence of God bless you as you wade in the water of faith. -Marc
