

September is National Hunger Action Month and the Society of St. Andrew (SoSA) invites us to join them and other congregations nationwide, in a month-long journey of reflection, action and generosity. Over 47 million people in the United States are currently hungry or food insecure. Yet this year alone, we will waste more than 40% of the food we grow—food that could feed our neighbors.

SoSA provides a Hunger Action Month Calendar and coin boxes to help us increase our hunger awareness and take simple actions to combat hunger. The calendar includes Scriptures, activities and prayer prompts for each day of September. A copy of the calendar is included with this month's newsletter, and extra copies are available in the Narthex.

Use a SoSA coin box to collect your spare change. Through SoSA's gleaning network, our coins can turn unharvested crops that would otherwise go to waste into nutritious food to feed hungry families. Last year, more than 20,000 SoSA volunteers picked, dug, and gathered fruits and vegetables from fields and orchards to share 88 million servings of food to with those in need. Collect your change throughout the month of September and return your box on World Communion Sunday, October 5. Hunger Action Month offerings will be blessed during worship on that Sunday. Coin boxes are available in the Narthex.

From Our Librarian

Confessions of a Converted Infidel – John Bayley – Forgotten Books, 2018 (originally published 1856)

John Bayley (1814-1880) was a member of the Virginia Conference of the Methodist Church in the

nineteenth century. This book is an examination of Bayley's life and his conversion experience. It also includes his views on the ministry to reach people. As some of you may know, Rev. Bayley ministered to a "community in Madison Heights, known as 'Burnt Woods' where it had been reported that 'wickedness'



was connected to this locality.' Rev. John Bayley was the first pastor and preached under a brush arbor where revivals were held during the years of 1876-1879." . He served the church until his death on February 25, 1880. The church established at that location in 1879 was named Bayley's Chapel in his memory. In 1995, Bayley's Chapel and Madison Heights UMC merged to become Amelon United Methodist Church. [Amherst County Heritage, p. 46]


