


velopment. The needs exceed what we can fund, and your gifts can further growth and success.

#### From Our Librarian . . . .

Holy Silence: The Gift of Quaker Spirituality J. Brent Bill, - Paraclete Press, 2005

Even in the busyness of life today, God still asks us to be still and listen to Him. "God is in His holy temple, Let all the earth keep silence before Him." We are drawn to silence and yearn for it. Sometimes we may have a time of quiet, but we really don't know what to

Visit our do with it. Silence is a way of worshiping, a way of getting in touch with God. Think of our own church services. Is there a time of absolute quiet? People become restless when nothing is happening. Each moment is filled with music or speaking. Even when there is a call for silent prayer, are we really si-

lent? There may be short periods of "quiet," but then the leader will offer a prayer suggestion, or the pianist or organist will play some "quiet" music. Where is the silence? How can we feel the presence of God or the Holy Spirit if we are "busy" listening to things outside of ourselves? In this book, the author takes us on a journey into the silence and helps us learn to look at the truth about ourselves, among other things. Noise keeps us from confronting who we really are - a child of God. God is ready and willing to talk to you, to answer your questions, to tell you how much He loves you and to give direction to your life. God doesn't speak in the wind, earthquake or fire, but in the "still small voice" or in the silence. "Be still and know..."

#### **October Communion Offering** to Benefit Hunters for the Hungry

This month, one half of the Communion offering will go to Hunters for the Hungry and the other half will go to our Local Relief Fund to assist those who come to our door needing assistance.

Hunters for the Hungry operates by solicitation of successful hunters to donate venison. The deer are accepted by professional meat cutters who process

(cut, wrap, and freeze) the venison. The meat is provided at no cost and is distributed by food banks and other 501 (C) (3) nonprofit organizations feeding Virginia's needy. They are not supported by any state funds or any



United Way Agency. Funds are raised to cover the cost of processing, distribution, and the overhead expenses of operation (less than 20% of total expenses). Financial support is currently the limiting factor.

Your generous donation on Communion Sunday will help these hunters feed the hungry, as well as help those who go to Interfaith Outreach looking for assistance.




